



Massive Demonstration Revolutionaries Against US-Japan Security Treaty

The ninth Anniversary of June 15 of our struggle against U.S.-Japan Security Treaty proved to be a most significant milestone for our stronger struggle against the Treaty to take place next Nine years ago on June 15, our comrade Michiko Kamba was killed by police force, while demonstrating in front of the Diet against the extension of the U.S.-Japan Security Treaty with tens of thousands of comrades. After nine years since then, more than 150,000 workers and students held commemorate meetings and demonstrations in scores of cities and towns all over the country, to reconfirm their memory of the police brutality and to reinforce their conviction in their struggle against U.S.-Japan Security Treaty.

In Tokyo, over 70,000 people held a meeting that day under the leadership of revolutionary political organisations including the Communist League, and held a demonstration after the meeting. We, the revolutionary organisations, must and dare accept the responsibility to organise these massive people for a significant struggle with a correct strategy for revolution.

The following is the summary of the declaration of six revolutionary organisations of their analysis and prospect of the struggle against the Treaty and against imperialists.

In the history of the class struggle in Japan of the post-war period, our struggle against U.S.-Japan Security Treaty in 1960 was an epoch-making one in that it was through this struggle that we came to denounce the Stalinist Japan Communist Party and organised the Communist League (Bund) as a vanguard party for revolution.

People's armament for destruction of imperialism!

Proletarian dictatorship instead of parliamentarism!

World revolution instead of "peaceful" coexistence!

Proletarian internationalism instead of nationalism:

Revolutionary workers, farmers and students, progressive intellectuals, stand up and take vour arms!

We take the honour to urge you to join our fighting front for a ever lasting class struggle on behalf of our comrade Michiko Kamba and other comrades who have been smashed to death by brutal rulers in the course of our struggle.

The constant struggle of the Vietnamese people has given birth to movements all over the world against the Vietnam war and struggles to support their fight for liberation. Above all, the nature of the struggles by revolutionary (continued on P.4)

1 000 Extinguish Imperialists

Struggle against U.S.-Japan Security Treaty

On April 28 this year, the massive class struggle in the 1970's was definitely began, armed with a strong ambition for PROLETARIAN DICTATORSHIP as opposed to the fascistic power reorganisation of the establishment and with a deep conviction of PROLE-TARIAN INTERNATIONALISM FOR WORLD REVOLUTION as opposed to the passive movement "for peace and democracy" of the post-war period. The struggle on this day also clearly declared that our struggle against U.S.-Japan Security Treaty is further aiming at the destruction of the Japanese imperialistic power. The fact that the state authorities applied the Subversive Activities Preventin Lawto our struggle on April 28 and desperately tried to suppress it with brutality shows that the problem of Okinawa is a viatal question also for the Japanese imperialists who have prepared a series of such invasive and counter-revolutionary programmes as the Foreign Minister's visit to U.S.A., participation in ASPAC and the extension of U.S.-Japan Security Treaty.

(1) With the serious crisis in Korea in this "post-Vietnam" peiod, Japanese imperialism is trying to expand its political and military control over South East Asia. For this purpose it is necessary for Japanese imperialism to conduct the sary for Japanese imperialism to send and keep the Defence Forces of Okinawa that have become their own imperialistic army, and to turn Okinawa into the front base for their invasion into Asia. Japanese imperialism is now trying to regain the position of the <u>Lord</u> of Asia by forming a counter-revolutionary alliance with U.S. imperialism.

(2) While the controlled economy of Japan based on capitalism is suffering from crisis, workers in minor enterprises, Farmers and students are also suffering from the evil efforts of the government to restore the stability of their economy. The bureaucrats of the "labour Unions" who are tamed by the establishment purged the leftist elements from their organisation, which against their intention, accellerated and heightened the real class struggle by genuine proletariat. So now, Japan is facing a even more serious socio-economic crisis. Under these circumstances, the government is fanatically trying to re-organise and re-unite the Japanese pdople in order to evade solving the crisis, by provoking (a) their control over South East Asia, (b) nationalistic patriotism (by saying "Get back Okinawa from America") and (c) anti-communism.

2. Nationalism or Internationalism

We, the Communists League (Bund), have been insiting on the following demands as our antitheses against "Reversion of Okinawa from America---Patriotism" has been advocated by bourgeoisie:

- a. Overthrow U.S. military control from Okinawa!
- b. Abolish their nuclear bases from Okinawa!
- c. Don't let the Japanese imperialism turn Okinawa into its front base of invasion into Asia!

The question of nationalism divided the Japanese into two segments on the occasion of April-28 struggle: one sided with the establishement power and the other fought against it. Those who sided with the bourgeoisie wer the Socialist and Communist Parties and the "labout unions" under their contro, as well as the Liberal Democratic Democratic Socialist and Fair Government Parties. Soon after the government's announcement of its will to "abolish nuclear weapons from Okinawa and to turn the military bases there under the same conditions as those in the mainland by 1972", the Socialist and Communist Parties, under the illusion of parliamentarism, de-escalated their movement into a conditional one only to express their will for reversion of Okinawa in a general sense, which actually is a mere expression of their consent to the government's plan, while up until then they had insisted on the "immediate and absolute(without bases) reversion of Okinawa. Esoecially the Communist Party, owing to its rediculous slogan of "revolution for national independence", came to turn its movement for Okinawa into an "anti-foreign" exclusionistic one, which is even worse than nationalistic one. - 2 -

Concerning the question of national territory, there is a group also in the revolutionary segment who claims a quite mistaken slogan. It is the who claims a quite mistaken slogan. It is the Cukaku faction (Revolutionary Communist League) who claims "recapture" of Okinawa becuase of their belief that neither the U.S. imperialists have any intention to return Okinawa to Japan, nor the Japanese imperialists expect them to do so. After all, though radical in strategy, they also are demanding for a mere territorial reversion of Okinawa and not an ideological revolution of the Japanese people.

We, the Communist League, necessity of forming an organisational solidarity with the radical groups in Okinawa who are struggling "to overthrow U.S.-Japan Security Treaty" from
their anti-war consciousness, rather than for a mere
territorial "reversion of Okinawa to Japan". We also support the revolutionary group there who are struggling "to overthrow U.S. military government and the growing Japanese imperialism". To cope with the reinforcement of exclutionism and the dangerous tendency for pogrom that were originated as reaction the crisis in Korea, we are now forming much stronger solidarity with the revolutionary struggle by the Koreans in Japan, thus consciously establishing revolutionary internationalism.

Proletarian Dictatorship against Fascism

On April 28 several thousand armed students, workers in addition to hundreds of thousands of people, orgainsed the most carefully-planned "armed struggle" in the capital; it was the most expressive example of the people's struggle in advanced nations for violent revolution and for proletarian dictator-

ship now underway all over the world.

Through this struggle we persued:

1. not only a political campaign in the capital but also an attack and occupation of the head quarters of the government to destroy the whole political and class structure supported by the Sato Covernment. 2. realisation of barricaded strike of factories and campuses with the armed fighting students and workers to turn the factories and campuses into our base for our struggle for occupation of the capital, which was also pursued by French revolutionaries in the May Revolution.

3. realisation of general strike with our own power apart from the conventional leadership of the Socialist and Communist Parties, thus to turn it into a permanent revolution.

In fact, we could accomplish only the second ose. And for the realisation of the first, we purpose. And for the realisation of the life, believe that we've got to reinforce our armanent and to organise and train a Red Army with students and workers. For realising the third, we've got to increase the number of workers with class consciousness and to organise them as proletarian revolutionary party (Vanguard Party).

4. Japan in the Course of World Revolution

With the continuation of the revolutionary struggle of the Vietnamese people and other repressed peoples in the colonies for their liberation, with the growing social and economic crisis in imperialist nations, and especially with the expansion of revolutionary group against the opportunistic and bureaucratic so-called "leftist" parties and labour unions all over the world, especially in imperialist nations, the revolution in imperialist nations is becoming more and more actual. The possibility of a revolution in an advanced nation, which was once denied by the victory of fascism in Germany and by the corruption of U.S.S.R. learders after World War Two, is now becoming restored by our struggles for world revolution and prolaterian distributions. gles for world revolution and proletarian dictator-ship with such strategies as occupation of government head quarters, mass strike, general strike by revolutionary students and workers.

Again, we emphasize the necessity of the solidarity of all revolutionary groups in the world for our simultaneous insurrection for world revolution! We make the following proposals to our comrades in Japan, Okinawa and U.S.A.:

CAMPUS TYRANNY UNIV. CONTROL LAW

Since the struggle at Haneda against the Prime Minister Sato's visit to South Vietnam on Oct. 8th, 1967, revolutionary people have been fighting everywhere, at universities. high schools, factories and cities, in order to shake fundamentally the ruling system. Last year the Zengakuren and massive revolutionary students, as vanguard of the struggles against the war in Vietnam and Imperialism, questioned the whole Educational System and occupied the campuses at 64 universities. Students' rebellion on all campuses was not initiated to enjoy student life, but to liberate their own "study" and "intellectuality" in universities that had been made into tools of the ruling class.

The dominant idea in the students' rebellion against the re-organization of the educational system and university, revealed the imperialistic re-organization of the whole society and the repression of people in the Japanese society. And even off-campus people joined their struggle. Especially with their unity with the Anti-War Youth Comittees, organization of revolutionary young workers, they made the first step for the occupation of local districts. Our struggles and occupations are surely going to smash the ruling system.

The new University Control Law, now under discussion at the Diet, is based on the "Report of the Contral Council on Education" and on the "Reform Plan of Faure" issued after the May Revolution in France.

The Ratification of this Law is aimed at crashing campus rebellions in all universities, vivid examples of which are the cases of Tokyo University, Nihon University and Kyoto University. The technique the authorities used are the following:

rule of capitalism: Reinforcement of industrial-military-aducational complex. Production of graduates as low-priced and chauvinistic working merchandise.

 rule of bureaucracy: Appointment of the vice-chancellor as governmental administrator. Suppression of the rebellions for disiplinary reasons by professors. Control of students' government.

rule of violence: Stationing of "riot-police" on campus. Training of anti-communist group on campus.

If this new University Law is to be ralified, a university under dispute will be "closed" or "abolished" by the Minister of Education. All rebelling students will be punished and the student body is to be changed to a tool for the authority. The culture and learning will always be under the control of the authority. Then, only the culture of fascism can be alive in the university.

By these measures which have been prepared for the ratification of the new Law, Japanese ruling class is trying to complete the imperialistic recorganization of university and the whole educational system, by the illusion of "peace and democracy, prosperity and pleasure" since the end of World War Two, to an imperialistic one, characterized by "invasion, repression and counter-revolution, chauvinism and pogrom".

We must strengthen our university occupation and our barricade against this new Control Law. In fact, over one hundred universities are striked by students against this Law and the U.S.-Japan Security Treaty.

Immiglation Law

By ratifying the immigration Control Law, the Japanese government is trying to rob the foreigners, especially the 600,000 Koreans, living in Japan of their freedom for political activities. This political oppression of the government over the suppressed Asian people in Japan derives from its own imperialistic intention for invasion into Asia and reinforcement of counter-revolution on this sphere that are seriously confronted with the strengthened anti-imperialist struggles of Asian peoples. The crisis in South Korea is also a crisis for Japanese imperialists' control over Korea. And their efforts for

the ratification of the Immigration Law are a part of Japanese imperilists counter-revolutionary strategy against the Korean people in Japan who form a strong base for the revolutionary struggle of Korea.

Japanese imperialists, anticipating that the crisis in Korea will lead to civil war, are now preparing themselves to send their Defence Forces, their counter-revolutionary army, to Korea. If they take this action, it will be the decisive moment for our radical class struggle in Japan in 1970's. The imprialists are also aware of the necessity for them to split the Japanese proletariat from other suppressed peoples of Asia (mainly from the people of Korea) for the realisation of their ambitions. In other words, they are trying to interfere with the struggle of Japanese proletariat by exclusionism.

If this Immigration Control Bill is passed, any foreigner who is arbitrarily recognised to have done a political activity by the police will be arrested and be sent back to his country, or his visa will be expired sortly. Up until now, under the Immigration Control Ordinance, such foreigners have been given the time to get a defender for a court trial where they can prove if he had been involved in a political activity or not. The prohibition of political activities is in itself unjust, but the elimination of the time for court trial is even worse; it is an absolute denyal of their human rights!

As Proletariat of Japan, we've got to realise our current significant task aiming at the destruction of Japanese imperialism and the U.S.-Japan Security Treaty to create and strengthen international anti-imperialist battling front against Immigration Control Bill to prove our strong solidarity with the peoples of Korea, of Asia and of the world. ORGANISE STRUGGLES against the Immigration Control Bill in factories, on campuses and in every part of Japan! SOLIDARI-TY WITH THE OTHER PEOPLES OF ASIA, especially with the Koreans most directly oppressed by Japanese imperial-

ASPAC Counterrevolution in Asia

From June 9. to 11., the fourth Asian Pacific Ministers Confference was held at Kawana Hotel in Ito, Shizuoka Pref. This counter-revolutio-

nary alliance of nine Asian anticommunist nations held the first conference in Seoul 1966, The second in Bangkok in 1967, and the third in Camberra in 1968.

This Conference was organised in answer to the demand of Asian anticommunist governments, especially Korean and Thai , for their unity to cope with their domestic growing crisis scince the retreat of U.S. power from the capitalist sphere.

It was formed, aiming at the new "Anti-Communist League" in the Asian Pacific Area, and it is expected that Japanese imperialism will play an active role in place of U.S. imperialism. At first, the Japanese imperialism did its best to avoid discussing the militarisation of ASPAC, becouse it had not been fully prepared ideologically and militarily. They pretended to regard ASPAC as an organisation for "economic collaboration". But in the course of the reorganisation of the relation between Japan and U.S.A. in Asia, Japanese imperiatism has been trying to grasp the controling power in Asia byestablishing a military force of its own.

As a result of the discussions at the last three ASPAC meetings, they have established the Social Cultural Center at Seoul and the Special Technicians Registration Organisation in Camberra. This year, with Laos and Thailand as ofservers, they decided on the establishment of Technical Centre for Food and Fertilizer at Taipei and Economic Centre at Bangkok, And Japan's proposal for "ASPAC Marine Collaboration Project" passed.

But these were not the real content of the meeting. The comminique announced after the meeting says things

like: "reconfirmed the deep sympathy with the position of the South Vietnamese government"; "To express the anxiety about the tention caused by provocative military attack". In the opening speech Prime Minister Sato said, "We appeal Asians to be clearly conscious that this area should be unified."

They feel the necessity to strengthen the counter-revolutionary system in Asia with growing Japanese imperialist invasion. This feeling of imperialists is also shown in President Nixon's statement two years ago in which be pressed his hope that the militarisation of ASPAC and new "collective system of Asia" (counter-revolutionary system) would be realised to take place of SEATO, with Japan as its central leader.

Last year the struggle to crash ASPAC was organised only by Communist League in the form of "Quartier Latin struggle in Japan" in a student's area in Tokyo on June 21, the occupation of "Midosuji Street" in Osaka on June 28, and the violent struggle to stop the Foreign Minister's visit to Australia at Haneda airport.

This year the criminal nature of ASPAC finally came to be understood by most people and a struggle against the Conference was organised by more than 10,000 people including Japan Communist Party and Japan Socialist Party near Kawana Hotel.

The town of Kawana with the population of only 3,000 was crowded with 7,000 cops. 3,000 revolutionary students and workers of Anti-War Youth Committees and Zengakuren armed with helmets, sticks and stones attacked the police, 300 arrested.

students in imperialist nations have undergone a toatl change. The struggles of revolutionaries have escalated into struggles to destroy their own governments that are also playing a criminal role in the Vietnam War. They now fight against the political and economic oppression by the governments and their efforts for imperialistic reorganisation.

Since the March-31 Johnson statement the world has been suffering a global crisis in the midst of the panic of dollar crisis, gold rush and the instability of the economic system based upon I.M.F. As to the revolutionaries' side, we have witnessed the May Revolution in France, strengthened struggles of students and young workers all over the world, and now we have the Temporary Revolutionary Government in South Vietnam. Our struggles have reached the point to actually overthrow all imperialists from the world.

In U.S.A. and in Europe revolutionary leftists have publicly rebelled against the reformist peace movement of conventional "leftists". They are organising masses of people with vivid and dynamic struggles, and they have definitely formed a new current in the leftist world.

This new current in the struggle against imperialism is fighting exclutionism and claiming world revolution and internationalism. All such revolutionaries must unite themselves under the name of internationalism.

Crisis in Asia expanded from Vietnam to Korea again with the U.S. "Focus Retina" Operation in early March this year. This greatest opration in history clearly indicates the fact that the imperialists military action for the "Security in Asia" is aiming at the suppression of armed class struggles of peoples all over the world. For imperialists Okinawa is the only base for their imperialistic control, and invasive counterrevolution in Asia. Okinawa will be the key question in 1970 when they will try to reinforce the

invasive and counter-revolutionary alliance and military partnership in Asia.

Under these circumstances, the Sato government is fanatically trying to reinforce the Defence Forces and the military power of Japan, radically revealing their intention of preservation and solidification of the imperialistic alliance of U.S. and Japan (U.S.-Japan Security Treaty establishment), nuclearisation of the Defence Forces, defence of the Far East, and sending army abroad.

We must not lower our struggle against U.S.-Japan Security Treaty into a mere struggle for its abolition but into a struggle to directly destroy the very root of Japanese imperialist power and to create proletarian dictatorship, which can only be achieved by unified direct action of masses of people. We must replace counterrevolution with revolution through which to strengthen our class struggle for the establishment of revolutionary Soviet system, Revolutionary workers, militant students, farmers and intellectuals all over the world! Ring the funeral bell to the old dead enemies! Future for ourselves! Join the fighting front and take the honourable task of opening the door to the new Era! Destroy U.S .- Japan Security Treaty and U.S .- Japan imperialist alliance! Victory for our struggle for Okinawa! Viva Proletarian World Revolution: Organise a strong unified fighting front to win our battle in 1970!
